Light straw with delicate light green reflections. Intense, long, continuous, persistent, from fruity to flowery depending on its step of evolution. Wide, sapid, flint scents, almond and walnut notes at the end.  
Excellent as an aperitif or throughout the whole meal; beside the typical white wines pairings (fish, shellfish and seafruits) it doesn't fear the pairing with white meats, poultry and light roasted meats.

**Far Niente Estate Chardonnay 2020**  
*Chardonnay – Napa Valley, California*

The 2019 Far Niente Chardonnay offers tropical aromas of citrus and melon layered with honeysuckle, perfume and toasted oak. A juicy entry transition to a vibrant, yet oily, palate, which builds to a clean and refreshing finish. This wine is well integrated and beautifully concentrated, with lush citrus flavors and hint of minerals.

**Vintage Tunina, Jermann 2019**

Vintage Tunina is a field blend made of Sauvignon, Chardonnay, Ribolla gialla, Malvasia and little percentage of a sweet local grape variety. It is bright straw-colored with golden reflections. The nose is intense, wide, very elegant and persistent with scents of honey and country flowers. To the palate it is dry, soft, well balanced with an extraordinary persistence due to its full body.

No fining, filtering or cold stabilization is used so wines may throw a fine sediment or tartaric crystals. Usually the wines are aged five years in bottle before release.
