Chassagne-Montrachet is located to the south of Puligny-Montrachet in the Côte de Beaune and is one of Burgundy's greatest white wine appellations. The Louis Latour winery was born in 1731. The wine offers aromas of white peach, vanilla and hazelnut. The palate is round with a mineral finish and a note of fresh almond.

#### **Sauternes, Chateau D'Yquem 2014**

*Sauvignon Blanc and Semillion- Sauternes, France*

The history of Château d'Yquem is like a novel. Château d'Yquem was English during the Middle Ages, in fact, the estate belonged to the King of England. In 1453, southwest France was once again brought under the dominion of the French. A century and a half later, in 1593, a descendent of a local noble family, Jacques Sauvage, was given feudal tenure over Yquem. The Gironde department archives, as well as those of the château, show that special winegrowing practices and late harvesting already existed at this time. A few years later, the Sauvage family built the château and patiently set about constituting the present-day vineyard, plot by plot. The family became full owners of Yquem in 1711, during the reign of Louis XIV.

*Corvina, Corvinone, Rondinella and Oseleta - Veneto, Italy*

The wine has a very intense ruby red color, the nose reveals intense and clean scents of very ripe cherry, black cherry, wild berries followed by fresh and slightly spicy tones. In the mouth it is dry and soft at the same time.

**Pauillac, Château Latour 2017**

**85 | 390**

*Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Petit Verdot – Pauillac, France*

The 2017 Pauillac De Château Latour is round and forward, with charming notes of ripe currants, dried tobacco, and sandalwood in its full-bodied, elegant profile.

**Pinot Noir, Wayfarer 2018**

**75 | 320**

*Pinot Noir – Sonoma Coast, California*

Violet, lavender and boysenberry aromas emerge from the glass, along with cherry, plum, dried herbs and fennel seed. A silky entry, lush body and creamy notes on the finish are juxtaposed by lively acidity, bringing a beautiful tension to the wine. This is a wonderfully complete Pinot Noir, a combination of focus and finesse.

**Special Selection ,Caymus 2018**

**125 | 520**

*Cabernet Sauvignon – Napa Valley, California*

A rich, dense ruby color, hints at the dark fruit nose of blackberry and currant that carries through to the palate, interwoven with complex aromas of black licorice, anise, and crème de cassis. On the palate, the wine opens up to reveal an earthiness, with brown spice, cigar box, and ripe dark fruits that linger throughout the extracted and long finish. The texture is opulent and rich, yet has a velvety quality with supple density. Rich, fine-grained tannins are balanced with ripe fruit, acidity, and oak.
