### WHITE LUXURY GLASS

5oz

**Chardonnay, Far Niente 2022** 32  
*Chardonnay – Napa Valley, California*

The 2022 Far Niente Chardonnay offers tropical aromas of citrus and melon layered with honeysuckle, perfume and toasted oak.

**Sancerre, “La Moussiere”, Alphonse Mellot 2022** 33  
*Sauvignon Blanc – Loire Valley, France*

This 100% Sauvignon white wine has a floral and fruity nose, combining white flowers with citrus fruits and a lively, refreshing palate.

**Cervaro della Sala, Marchesi Antinori 2022** 42  
*Chardonnay and Grechetto – Umbria, Italy*

A full-bodied white with complex aromas of hawthorn, ripe peach, apricot, mango, lime, flint, toast and some smoke. Layered, concentrated and persistent with bright acidity and a firm, phenolic texture. Hint of vanilla. Very long and refined.

**Chablis Ier Cru “Vaillons”, Simonnet–Febvre 2022** 34  
*Chardonnay – Bourgogne, France*

This wine is an excellent example of the characteristics of a Chablis wine: freshness, acidity, minerality and notes of flowers and fruit. Well-rounded and charming.

**Gavi “Black Label”, La Scolca 2022** 32  
*Cortese – Piemonte, Italy*

Light straw with delicate light green reflections. Intense, long, continuous, persistent, from fruity to flowery depending on its step of evolution. Wide, sapid, flint scents, almond and walnut notes at the end.

**Amarone della Valpolicella Classico Dcog, Paolo Cottini** 2018 **40**  
*Corvina, Corvinone and Rondinella – Veneto, Italy*

A mature and complex wine with notes of black fruits, leather, chocolate, and a hit of spices.

**Pinot Noir, Flowers** 2022 **30**  
*Pinot Noir – Sonoma Coast, California*

A balanced wine with persistent mid palate that is laced with acidity and tart cherry, red currents, Bergamot, finishing light with a twist of Blood Orange.

**Alberelli di Giodo, Carlo Ferrini** 2017 **37**  
*Nerello Mascalese – Sicily, Italy*

This is the first vintage of famed Italian wine consultant Carlo Ferrini's own Etna wine, and it is a lovely debut. It has a charming nose of red cherries, vanilla, spice and white chocolate.

**Brunello di Montalcino, Madonna Nera** 2018 **37**  
*Sangiovese – Toscana, Italy*

The wine is intense, dense, tight, and deep in flavor with the cherry fruits of the Sangiovese bursting through along with spicy peppery flavours balancing the wine and pulling it altogether.

**Cabernet Sauvignon, Duckhorn** 2021 **37**  
*C. Sauvignon, Merlot, C. Franc and P. Verdot – Napa Valley, California*

Rich and complex with aromas of black cherries and cinnamon spice, the wine has elegant tannins and a long finish.

**No Name, Borgogno** 2020 **38**  
*Nebbiolo – Barolo, Italy*

Gorgeous plum aromas with flowers and hints of hazelnuts and dried fruit, medium bodied with soft tannins very elegant

Barbaresco is characterized by its rich, spicy flavors and perfumed sweetness and is considered more elegant and refined than its counterpart (Barolo). Barbaresco must have minimum two years of aging, one of which must be spent in wooden barrels.

## BAROLO

Barolo is a traditional hillside village in the rolling hills of Piemonte, northwestern Italy. To earn the name Barolo, the wines must undergo at least 38 months' aging prior to commercial release, of which 18 must be spent in barrel. As the tannins soften over time, the complexity shows through with hints of earth, truffles and dark chocolate.
